Five Senses Preschool Lesson Plans | Early Childhood ...

Materials Needed: 2 1/2 cups flour, 1 packet of unsweetened Kool-aid, 1 cup of salt, 2 tablespoons of vegetable oil, 2 cups of water. Heat the water up (in the microwave or on the stove). Add in the kool aid and the oil. In a separate bowl, mix in 2 cups of the flour and all of the salt.

If you have another book that you like to use, that's great. The book should just give an overview of the five senses.
